The Queen was serenaded throughout the evening in a starstudded show with performances by the world-famous Duke Ellington Orchestra, led by the son of the late bandleader-composer, Mercer Ellington; hit balladeer Keith Washington, and Motown recording stars Dee Harvey and Shanice.

"The Ellington Orchestra was fabulous," she told JET after their swinging performance. "When they got in high gear, they were all the way up, all the way live. Mercer has taken over that band fabulously," she raved.

The Queen had royal praise for her other special guest performers. "Keith is beautiful. He's really just a beautiful person. He rose to the occasion," she exclaimed. "I hope that he will maintain his naturalness. He's very passionate and he has a lot of heart and soul." She continued, "Shanice is delightful. She's got a record in the top 10 *I Love Your Smile*. She's a lovely young lady. She's very wholesome and that's very refreshing; wholesome and a very nice young lady."

As for Dee Harvey, "he is one of the newest, best young singers I've heard lately," she said. "He is definitely one of the best male
